Course Description:

This course offers an introduction to a range of issues pertaining to the emergence of the commercial theatre in Britain. Using an extensive range of on-line materials, students will be examining the interplay between between commercial theatrical performance and other entertainment media in London from 1750 to 1830. Garrick and Sheridan will loom large in the course, but we will also be looking at a host of illegitimate venues and "low" genres. Wherever possible we will be working from primary archives and will be attempting to reconstruct performances with an eye for how they were remediated in the press. Along the way, a consideration of theoretical issues in historicization will animate the course.
